 - b. Numbers have declined
 - c. Staff and Students are getting vaccinated
 - d. Test kits available on campus are helping
 - e. Last week was the first week front doors were opened
 - i. Parents still not allowed on campus during the day
 - f. Campuses are still closed to general public for safety
 - g. Input:
 - i. Allergy season: how do we get kids to be comfortable
 - 1. Optional if student is going to be tested
 - 2. Ask a lot of the Assessment questions then make a determination on testing
 - ii. Lower Level
 - 1. Continue to keep the campus closed since the younger students can't be vaccinated
 - 2. Established a new norm, parents are not trying to fight the school. Keeping the students safe both with COVID and school safety.
 - iii. Sanitizing
 - 1. Supplies sent to campuses are allowing teachers and custodial staff to help team up together to keep the campus clean
 - iv. Test kit
 - 1. Test is not invasive and not as at the beginning of COVID
 - 2. Are students being made aware of the COVID test and encourage to continue wash hands
 - 3. More district announcements
- 4. Restroom damage and reviews of campus restroom policies
 - Pictures of the restrooms at the campuses with the damage being done by students due to TikTok challenge
 - o Urinals
 - Soap dispensers (currently a soap shortage)
 - o Plumbing

 - Soap issue/Now using bar soap in front of restrooms
 - Clogging toilets with soap bottles
 - Ripping mirrors off of the walls
 - Patricians
 - Traffic in hallways
 - Intermediate restrooms
 - A lot of traffic going to the restrooms
 - Hard for teachers to determine of it is an emergency
 - Parents then get upset and complain
 - 10/10 policy
 - Sign out sheets
 - Currently a no Restroom Policy (it's needed)
 - Thoughts:

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- MS 3 passes a 6 weeks
- Limited as to when a student can go
- o Students need to be told not to abuse the restroom
- Police on campuses: are they sitting or being proactive
 - Officers will not walk into the restrooms
 - Secondary to all disciplinary
 - Goal is safety
 - All disciplinary is on Administration and Staff
 - Officers are near the restrooms at MS and HS
 - Lower grades; Officers stay clear of restrooms
 - Tip Line for students to call and alert district
 - Currently a bully hotline-could change the name
 - Students need to not be afraid to report
 - Posted information; accessible to students
 - Students need accessibility to forward videos
 - Students need to have pride in the campus
 - What is the consequence
- Middle School
 - Limiting the student restroom access
 - Charged the parents for cost to damage to restroom
- Restroom Passes
 - 3 passes for students
 - Dr. Orders on file at High School (Google List)
 - All teachers on campus have updated list
 - Restroom passes given by school nurse
 - Parent responsibility to notify the campus if student has a medical issue
 - Sign in and sigh out in restroom
 - Give teacher the phone in order for students to go the restroom
 - Teachers need to take up phone
 - MS no backpack day tomorrow; Dance at Middle School
 - Students and Parents need to be held to a higher standard
 - Concrete evidence is needed; if not student needs to be placed on notice
 - Sound sensors; vaping system, glass breaking etc....
 - Vaping sets up fire alarm

 - Restrooms: doors being installed
 - Recommendation to make all restrooms ADA compliant
 - Limit the number of restrooms to help principals monitor
